



Chamblee High School
Principal Advisory Council Summary
January 11, 2022, 7:15 – 8:00am

Key Actions:

1. The CHS PAC discussed adding representatives from the CHS Student Government and PTSA to the PAC. A. Milne will review the PAC bylaws to determine the best way to do this to give these organizations some input into the PAC. He will also discuss this idea with these 2 organizations to determine interest level and who might be the best representatives(s) to attend the PAC meetings. (Updated: Tabled until February meeting).
2. B. Concepcion has resigned due to moving out of the district. To fill the vacancy, the CHS PAC will extend an invitation to M. Ochoa to join the PAC for a 1-year term, as the next highest vote receiver in the PAC election held last spring. In addition, the PAC voted to extend D. Martin-Gerstle's term from 1-year to 2-years, as B. Concepcion's term was 2 years.

Informational Items:

1. Ongoing staffing needs exist: custodian, paras and a nurse. Additional staff is always needed in Special Education. The transfer window in DCSD will open shortly and then hiring will move into filling positions for the 2022-2023 school year.
2. The Continuous School Improvement Plan (CSIP) for CHS identifies 2 priorities for the 2021-2022 school year. These are 'Literacy across all Curriculums' & 'Graduation Rates'. The plan to address these 2 priorities is outlined in the CSIP posted on the CHS PAC webpage.
3. In the Region 1 PAC meeting with M. Pearch, it was indicated that there are no future expansion plans for the CHS athletic fields. It is possible that usage of the stadium by CHS could be reviewed, as DHS now has a turf practice field.
4. In the district wide PAC CMP meeting H. Williams with DCSD indicated there would be massive redistricting with the addition of a Sequoyah cluster. General feeling within the CHS PAC is that this massive redistricting is 2-3 years out.
